AB 1942	Nava (D- Santa Barbara)	<b>Arrests:</b> Would develop protocols by law enforcement and other entities, pertaining to arresting caretaker parents or guardians of minors, to ensure the safety and well-being of the minor	Senate Approp.
AB 1981	Bass ( D- Los Angeles)	<b>Anti-Recidivism Grants:</b> – Would create a competitive grant program through the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation for community-based organizations to establish and operate reentry services for inmates.	DEAD
AB 2035	Cogdill (R- Modesto)	<b>Conservation camps – Madera County</b> – Require to house up to 120 inmates trained as conservation camp inmates at the Central California Women’s Facility or the Valley State Prison for Women.	DEAD
AB 2066	Lieber (D- Mountain View)	<b>Corrections: Female Inmates</b> – Would require the Department of Corrections to create a Female Reform Master Plan and conduct a research study of victimization of female offenders, in addition, require CDCR to develop community-based programs and secure 4500 beds over two years, to promote successful reentry into society	Senate Public Safety
AB 2192	Bass (D- Los Angeles)	<b>CalWORKs:</b> Provide that a person convicted of a drug-related felony may be eligible for CalWORKs benefits under certain conditions.	Senate Human Services
AB 2266	Lieber (D- Mountain View)	<b>Death Penalty: moratorium</b> – Would establish a moratorium on the use of the death penalty until certain criteria are met.	DEAD
AB 2917	Liu (D- LaCanada)	<b>Inmates: female offenders</b> – Establish a permanent commission to evaluate the conditions of women inmates and make findings and recommendations to CDCR so that it can develop gender responsive strategies and programs.	Senate Public Safety
AB 2925	Montanez (D- San Fernando)	<b>Victims: automated notification</b> – Express the intent of the legislature to enact legislation to establish a statewide automated victim identification and information system to better inform victims of the custody status or release of their assailants.	DEAD
AB 3064	Committee on Public Safety	<b>Corrections: Reentry Advisory Committee</b> – Require the Secretary to establish a Reentry Advisory Committee to advise the Secretary on matters related to the successful planning, implementation and outcomes of all reentry programs and services in the department with the goal of reducing recidivism.	Senate Public Safety
SB 1119	Migden (D- San Francisco)	<b>Reprieves, pardons and commutations of sentence:</b> This bill would provide that the Judicial Counsel and Supreme Court shall adopt competency standards for appointed counsel for clemency proceedings.	Assembly Approp.
SB 1547	Romero (D – Los Angeles)	<b>Corrections: Inmate population</b> – would make findings and declarations regarding the growing inmate population and require CDCR to establish programs that will parole geriatric or medically incapacitated inmates, provide additional sentence reduction for eligible inmates who progress in various programs.	Assembly Public Safety

SB 1453	Speier (D – Hillsborough)	<b>Participation in imprison drug treatment program; mandatory aftercare</b> – would provide certain inmates under the custody of CDCR, after successful completion of an imprison drug treatment program, upon parole, shall whenever possible be entered into a residential aftercare treatment program. If a parolee successfully completes 150 days of residential aftercare, he/she will be discharged from parole.	Assembly Public Safety
SB 1521	Romero (D- Los Angeles)	<b>Prisons: media access</b> – Would require the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation to permit news representatives to interview inmates.	Assembly Approp.
SB 1569	Kuehl (D-Los Angeles)	<b>Human Services: immigrants</b> –would provide access to critical services for immigrant survivors of human trafficking, domestic violence and other serious crimes.	Assembly Human Services
SB 1589	Romero (D – Los Angeles)	<b>Division of Juvenile Justice: specialized programming</b> – Require the DJJ to explore option to provide specialized programming outside the division for high risk or high need juvenile offenders.	Assembly Public Safety
SB 1642	Romero (D-Los Angeles)	<b>Sentencing: three strikes</b> – This bill would provide that if the current felony is not a serious or violent felony the person would be sentenced to the enhancement under the 3-strikes provisions that is applicable to a person with one prior conviction.	Senate Floor
